Industry benchmarks have proven that introducing the eMAR system makes significant improvements to the quality and safety of administering medications to residents and also streamlines the medication records to give accurate and timely information to our clinical staff.

After many months of planning and infrastructure upgrades to enable this new technology, the eMAR tablets were installed on our medication carts and our nursing staff completed intensive system training in early July. eMAR went "Live" on July 23rd and we are already experiencing the many benefits that this system brings to the care that we provide.
