On October 29, 2014 the Associate Minister of Health and Long-Term Care announced the Enhanced Long-Term Care Home Renewal Strategy:

“Ontario is moving forward with enhanced plans to redevelop approximately 300 older long-term care homes in the province.

To ensure continued safety and quality of care for residents, Ontario will work with long-term care home operators, residents and their advocates, as well as Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs) to bring all long-term care homes up to the highest design standards. “

Saint Luke's Place Chief Executive Officer, Brian Swainson, has been invited to be one of three OANHSS representatives sitting on the Stakeholder Advisory Committee for the Enhanced Long-Term Care Home Renewal Strategy.

Soliciting advice from the Stakeholder Advisory Committee in priority areas will support the Ministry in developing and finalizing a robust program that encourages and supports operators to redevelop their Long-Term Care Homes to best meet the needs of Ontario's Long-Term Care Home residents.
