We kicked off the celebration by having Bob McLean come entertain.... what a great time!




#### Long Term Care

#### INFECTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL



Back in June the Ministry of Long Term Care announced that **Masking is no longer required** for staff and visitors. Please note:





- We do encourage masking as a "Mask Friendly Home"; however, they are not required
- If you are feeling unwell, we do encourage you to stay home to reduce the risk of spread within Saint Luke's Place

Remember, hand hygiene is the most important step in spreading any type of illness, infection or disease. "Clean Your Hands!" - It only takes 15 seconds



## The 4 Moments for Hand Hygiene in All Health Care Settings:

- 1. BEFORE initial resident/resident environment contact
- 2. BEFORE aseptic procedure
- 3. AFTER body fluid exposure risk
- 4. AFTER resident/patient environment contact



#### To clean hands with alcohol-based hand rub:

- 1. Use enough alcohol-based hand rub to cover all areas of your hands
- 2. Rub hands for at least 15 seconds or until product is dry on your hands

Cleaning your hands frequently and as often as necessary with a 15 second scrub can keep you and those you love healthy anytime, anywhere.

#### **FLU VACCINE**

The flu shot is the best way to reduce your risk of getting sick with influenza and spreading it to others. In elderly people, the vaccine can prevent pneumonia, hospitalization and death. It is especially important to get your flu shot this season, due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Protection against influenza will prevent additional burden on our health care system, protect us, and those most vulnerable in our families and community.

#### Where to get the flu shot (community):

- Health care providers
- Pharmacies
- Walk-in (Urgent Care) Clinics

Here at Saint Luke's Place for residents and staff the flu vaccine will be made available through the Director of Infection Prevention and Control office. #### Long Term Care

#### **NURSING**

In December 2020, the provincial government released "A Better Place to Live, A Better Place to Work: Ontario's Long Term Care Staffing Plan".

Among other measures, this Staffing Report commits to investing in providing an average of four hours of care to all residents. This increase will be phased in over time by the year 2024/25 Here at Saint Luke's Place, we have already added additional shifts or extended shifts for days, evening and nights in direct care staffing and have plans to increase even more hours in our direct care hours to reach the 4 hours of care requirement by 2025- we are excited!

Just for your information: For the past few months we have been tracking our nursing staffing, especially over weekends to ensure we have the coverage necessary to provide quality care and services.

#### Here are the stats:

June: 98.80% coverage July: 98.08% coverage August: 97.25% coverage
