LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

INFECTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL

BREAK THE CHAIN OF INFECTION

Infection Control in Ontario Long-Term Care Homes

At Saint Luke's Place, we take infection prevention and control seriously. Our dedicated employees work hard every day to keep residents and staff safe.

Key Strategies:

Frequent Hand Hygiene

Encourage regular and thorough handwashing to reduce the spread of germs.

Proper Use of PPE

Ensure masks, gloves, and other protective equipment are worn correctly and consistently.

Environmental Cleaning

Disinfect high-touch surfaces regularly to minimize contamination.

Ongoing Surveillance

Monitor residents and staff for symptoms of infection to enable early detection and response. If you have any questions regarding our infection, prevention and control program or resources, please reach out to info@stlp.ca.

Why Get the Flu Vaccine?

The flu vaccine is your best defense against influenza. It's recommended every year in the fall, ideally before flu season begins. Almost everyone 6 months and older should get vaccinated.

Benefits of the Flu Vaccine

- Reduces Your Risk
- Lowers your chances of getting the flu.
- Prevents Serious Complications
- Helps protect against severe flu-related illness.
- Protects Others
- When you're vaccinated, you're less likely to spread the flu to family, friends, and those most vulnerable.

Colds & Flu Spread Easily

So, if you're feeling under the weather—even just a little—it's best to skip the visit and stay home.

The Ministry of Long-Term Care oversees long-term care in Ontario, including: supporting the building of new homes and upgrading outdated homes. Setting the legislation, regulations and policies that all homes must follow.

How do I contact the minister of long-term care in Ontario? If you are not satisfied with the home's response, you can contact the Ministry of Long-Term Care directly through the Long-Term Care Family Support and Action Line by phone at: 1-866-434-0144 (toll free). The hours of operation are 8:30 a.m.-7:00 p.m., 7 days a week.

Saint Luke's Place is a charitable, non-profit, accredited long-term care home and seniors' community that has proudly served the Cambridge region for nearly 50 years. With 114 longterm care beds, 132 independent senior apartments, and a vibrant Seniors Active Living Centre, we remain a trusted and compassionate partner in the lives of local seniors and their families.

Our Vision



We're Growing to Meet Urgent Needs. Through the Welcome Home Capital Campaign, Saint Luke's Place is building a state-ofthe-art, 192-bed long-term care home right here in Cambridge. This new residence will add 78 beds to our current 114, helping address the critical shortage of long-term care spaces in our region. Groundbreaking is scheduled for 2025, with completion expected in 2028.

Our modern six-storey building will feature:

- Enhanced resident comfort and privacy
- Innovative care spaces designed for dignity and connection
- Amenities that foster community and well-being



Infection Prevention Tips for Seniors

As we age, the immune system naturally weakens, making older adults more vulnerable to illness and infection. Many seniors also manage chronic health conditions, which can increase susceptibility. Whether at home, in the community, or in a care setting, these steps can help reduce risk:

Get Recommended Vaccines

Vaccines protect against serious illnesses like flu, pneumonia, COVID-19, and more. Talk to your doctor about which vaccines or boosters are right for you.

Wash Hands Often

Germs spread easily from hands to eyes, nose, and mouth. Wash with soap and water frequently—especially after touching high-traffic surfaces like doorknobs, handrails, and elevator buttons. If soap isn't available, use hand sanitizer. Encourage others to do the same.

Clean High-Touch Surfaces

Disinfect common surfaces regularly with sprays or wipes to reduce germ transfer between people.

Cover Coughs & Sneezes

Use a tissue or your elbow to block germs from spreading through the air—and keep your hands cleaner.

Avoid Contact with Sick Individuals

If someone is ill, politely postpone visits until they're feeling better.

Speak Up About Concerns

If you notice symptoms or have questions about your health or medications, contact your doctor promptly. Ask about proactive steps to stay healthy and prevent infection.

MESSAGE FROM THE CEO



Chief Executive Officer

Things continue to be busy at Saint Luke's Place. There were several Halloween events held in October, including a haunted house and a sing-a-long, that were greatly appreciated by residents and tenants. The recent time change, our days getting shorter, and our first snowfall of the season tell us that winter has arrived. As always, at Saint Luke's Place, we continue to closely monitor the air quality and indoor temperatures to ensure the comfort and safety of our vulnerable population.

The final inspection for our new LTC sprinkler and fire alarm system installation was completed on October 22 by the City of Cambridge and the Cambridge Fire Department. This work was mandated under the Fire Protection and Prevention Act to be completed in all LTC homes by July 1, 2026. We are pleased Saint Luke's Place completed this large, very important project over the past year, keeping everyone safe.

We continue to work closely with our architects (MMMC), construction manager (Traugott Building Contractors), the Ministry of LTC, and the City of Cambridge on our 192-bed redevelopment project. Our next steps include obtaining permits, getting final approvals from the Ministry of LTC, and continuing our fundraising efforts for our Welcome Home Capital Campaign. The goal is to start construction by the end of this year.

Staffing continues to hold, and we are fully staffed, sitting at an average of 99% for front-line staff over the last four weekends.

Many thanks to our volunteers, staff, and physicians for your ongoing commitment to providing high-quality, compassionate care for the tenants, residents, and families we are so privileged to serve, and thank you to the Cambridge community and SLP families for your constant support.

From all of us at Saint Luke's Place, we wish you a safe, joyful, and happy holiday season!


